


INTRODUCTION

SOME FACTS

From 1983 to 2015, there is a 329% increase for people that are locked up in Georgia. (Vera Institute)

According to 'Era of Mass Expansion: Why State
Officials Should Fight Jail
Growth' by Joshua Aiken,
more than 50% of the inmates
in jail are pretrial or
unconvicted.

Georgia houses around 4% of total prisoners in the entire United States; more than 53,000 inmates. (Vera Institute)

Georgia is ranked 3rd in: Jail Admissions, Prison
Population, Jail Sentenced
Population, and Jail Pretrial
Population. (Vera Institute)

Since 1980, there is a 600% increase of woman in prison. (Vera Institute)
